

## Information for users of the Political Archive of the Federal Foreign Office

1. The Political Archive contains records of the (Federal) Foreign Office, the Foreign Ministry of the German Democratic Republic and German missions abroad covering the period from 1867 up to the present day.

Under the Federal Records Act of Jan 6, 1988 (Federal Law Gazette I, p 62), as most recently amended on June 5, 2002 (Federal Law Gazette I, p 1782) and the Regulations for Users of the Political Archive of the Federal Foreign Office, records over 30 years old may be freely consulted upon application.

In principle, however, access to records relating to natural persons is restricted until 30 years after their death.

There is no access to classified documents.

- 2. Applications to use the Political Archive must be submitted to the Federal Foreign Office in writing, stating the topic, purpose, time and duration of the intended research as precisely as possible.
  - Applicants should make sure their applications arrive at least two or three weeks before their planned visit so that they can be notified whether their application has been approved and a work station in the Reading Room can be reserved accordingly.
  - Archive material may only be consulted once written approval has been received from the Federal Foreign Office.

- 5. Copy services are provided on a commercial basis by private companies. The Federal Foreign Office accepts no liability for such services. Order forms are available from the Reading Room supervisor (prices: EUR 0.30 per page on microfilm, EUR 0.50 per page for paper copies, EUR 0.45 per page/image on DVD, excluding forwarding and bank charges).
  - Records which have been wholly copied onto microfiche may only be duplicated as microfiches or reproduced from microfiche onto A4 paper (prices: EUR 1.59 per microfiche copy (containing up to 98 pages), EUR 0.35 per page for paper reproductions, excluding forwarding and bank charges).
- 6. The use of private digital cameras in the Reading Room requires special permission, to be obtained from the Reading Room supervisor.
- 7. The Reading Room is open Monday to Thursday from 8.30 to 16.30 h and on Friday from 8.30 to 15.00 h. It is located on the fourth floor of the Federal Foreign Office building at Kurstrasse 33 (entrance), D-10117 Berlin (between Werderscher Markt and Gertraudenstrasse).

Upon entering the building users must show on demand their letter of admission to the Political Archive. They should also have with them an identity card or passport that they can deposit in exchange for a visitor's pass.

Since there is no parking on the premises, the use of public transport is recommended:

- U 2 to Hausvogteiplatz or Spittelmarkt
- Bus 147 from S-Station Friedrichstrasse or Ostbahnhof to Werderscher Markt
- Bus 148 from S-Station Alexanderplatz or Potsdamer Platz to Spittelmarkt.
